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MAKING A COMPLAINT

Who can you make a formal complaint about?

You can make a complaint about an authorised electrical worker, when a disciplinary offence has occurred. An authorised electrical worker is one who is registered and/or licensed.

You can also make a complaint about a person who is not registered and/or licensed to do prescribed electrical work. Prescribed electrical work is defined in the Electricity Act 1992.

What can you make a formal complaint about?

You can make a complaint about anyone who does prescribed electrical work, provided it meets the criteria set out below.

A disciplinary offence is electrical work:

- · done in an incorrect, negligent or incompetent way
- · does not meet the requirements of the appropriate regulations or standard
- · where unsafe fittings were installed
- · that is unsafe or fittings were concealed
- where documents such as Certificates of Compliance were not given
- · where unqualified workers were allowed to do electrical work
- where the worker was not authorised to the do the work. This means that their registration and/or licence does not authorise them to do
 the work.

What can't you make a formal complaint about?

The complaints process does not cover things like billing (e.g. overcharging) or damage to property. These are not disciplinary offences that fall under the jurisdiction of the EWRB. If you have this type of complaint, you could contact your local Citizens Advice Bureau, the Disputes Tribunal, or Ministry of Consumer Affairs.

What happens to your complaint?

Your complaint will be reviewed by the Registrar to see whether it

- is complete
 - > If the Registrar considers your complaint incomplete it will be sent back to you for further information. An incomplete complaint cannot be investigated.
- falls under the EWRB's jurisdiction
 - > If the complaint does satisfy these categories it will be referred to the EWRB for investigation.
- · is deemed to be frivolous or vexatious
 - > If the registrar considers your complaint frivolous or vexatious (Section 144 (4) of the Electricity Amendment Act 2006) no further action will be taken.
